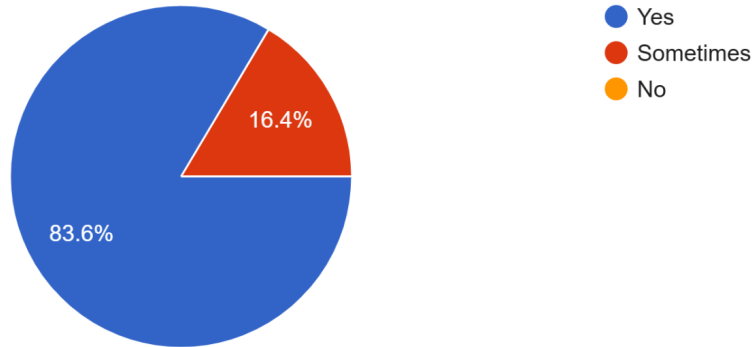

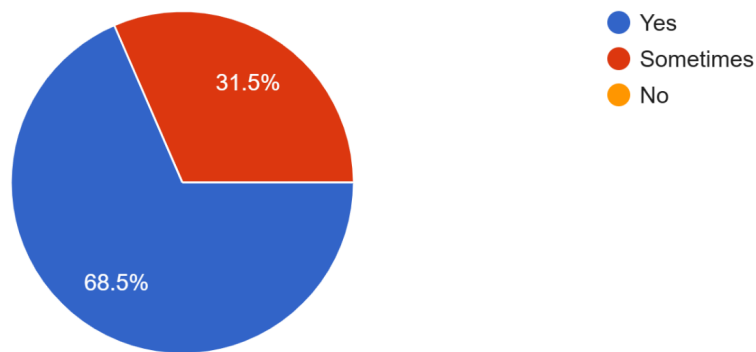
I consider an ethical lifestyle part of living out my Christian faith.

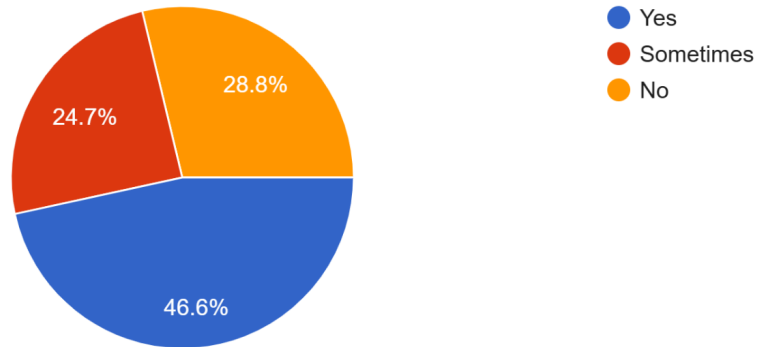
I regularly thank God for Creation and pray for its protection

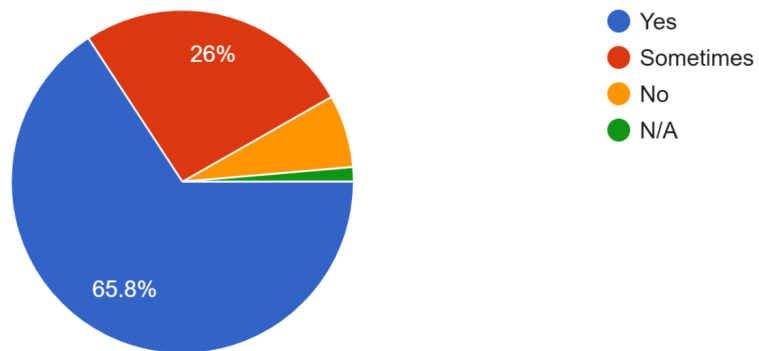
I walk, cycle or car-share to church services and events

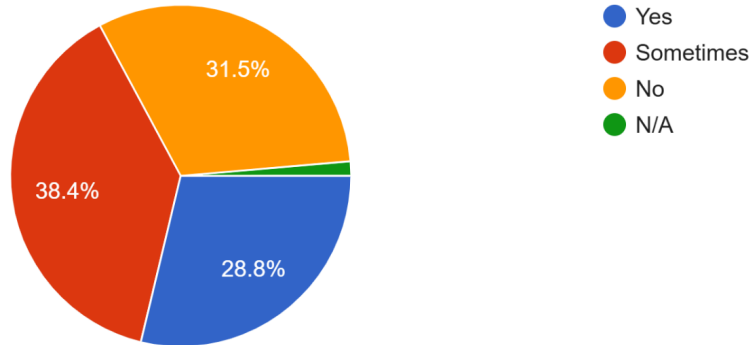
I try to reduce my car use when possible

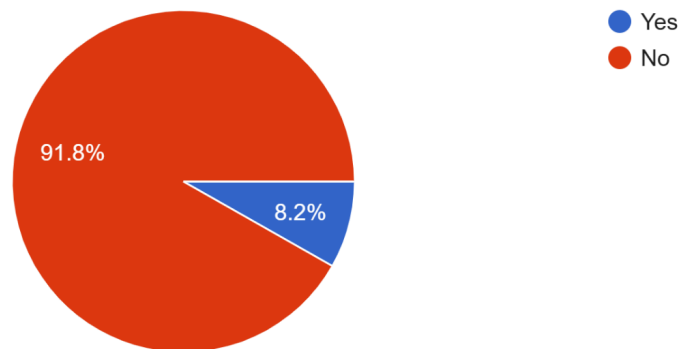
I consider my impact on Creation when I decide on where to go on holiday and how to get there

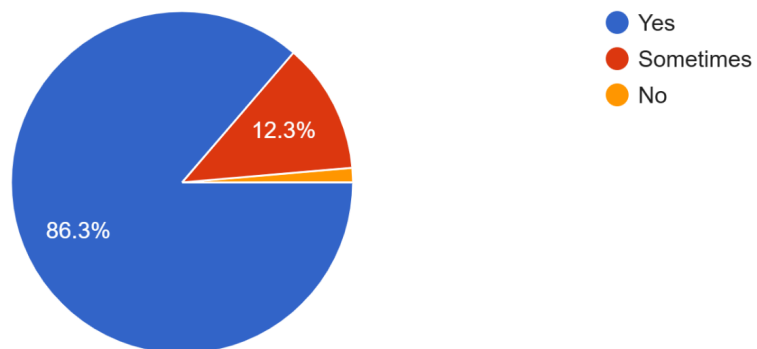
I have completed a personal carbon footprint audit within the last year

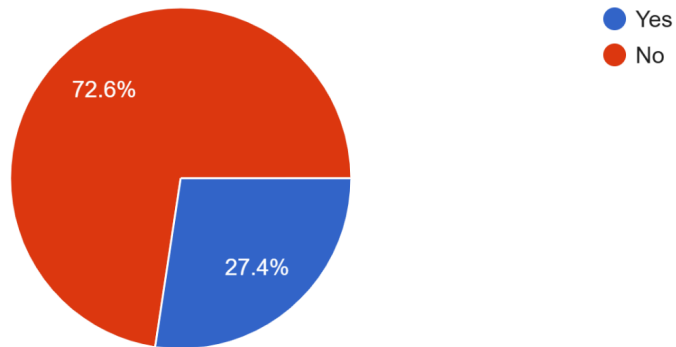
I limit my waste by adhering to the principles of reduce, reuse, recycle.

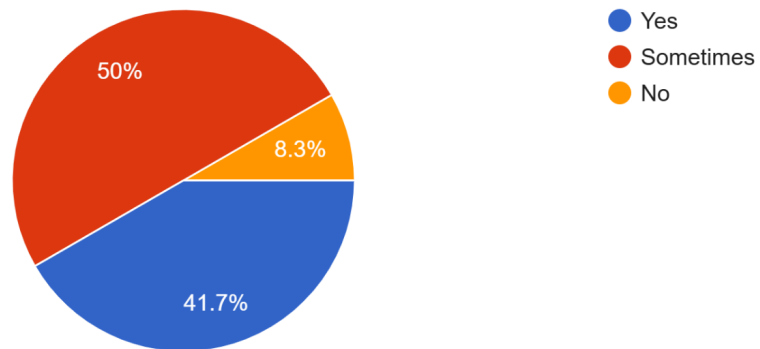
I have attended the repair cafe within the past year.

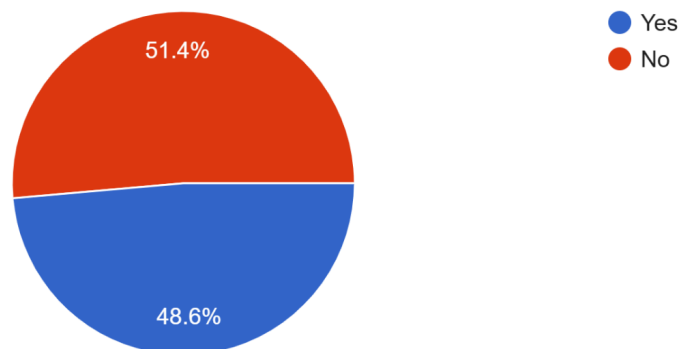
I seek to purchase Fairtrade goods where possible

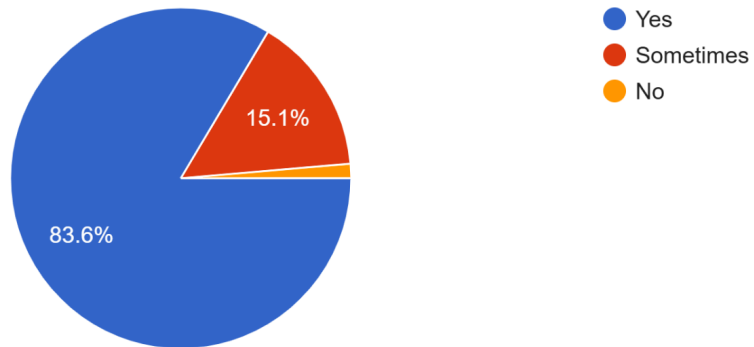
My home is on a renewable electricity tariff

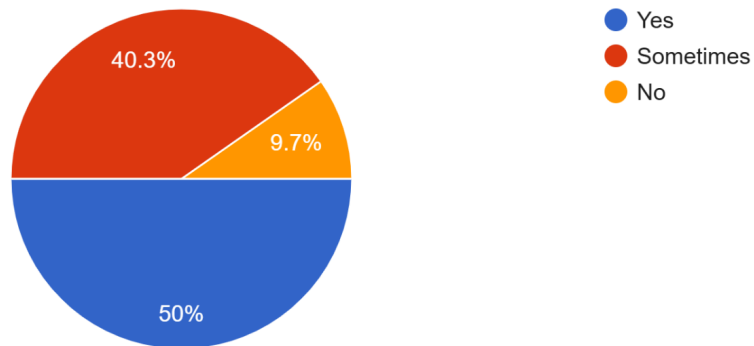
At home we try to turn lights off and not leave things on standby

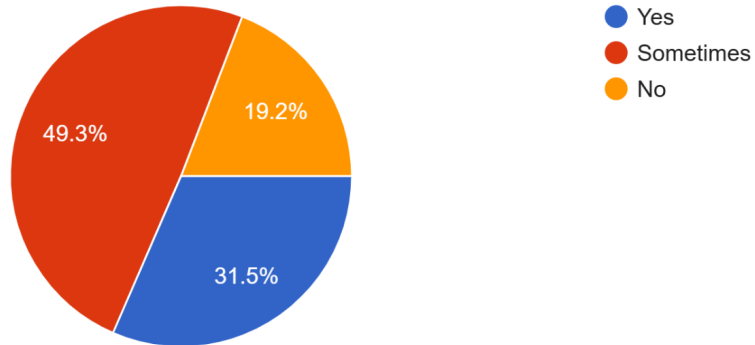
I seek to purchase ethically where possible (e.g. check source of products, buy less, bulk buy for less packaging, second hand purchases)

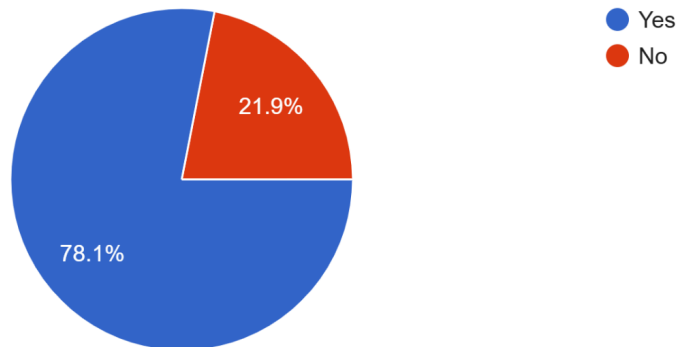
I try to follow the LOAF principles (Locally grown, Organic, Animal friendly, Fairtrade) when buying food

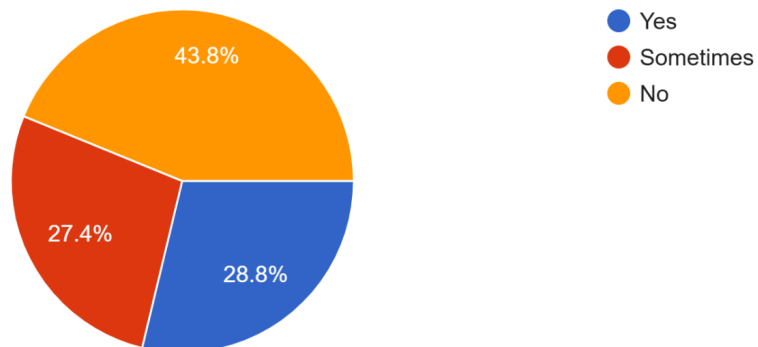
I have reviewed and made changes to my diet to be healthier and more sustainable (e.g. less meat)

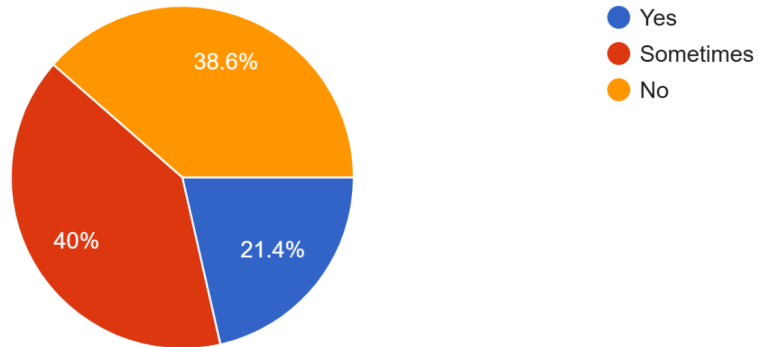
I consider where I put my money by using ethical banking, savings accounts and/or investments.

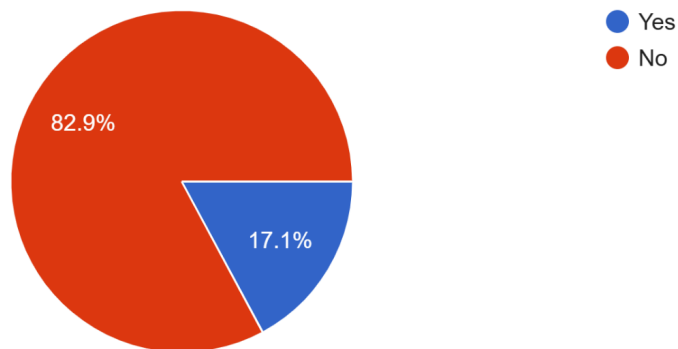
I participate in earth-caring community activities (e.g. litter pick events, Village Magpies recycling, member of a Creation care group).

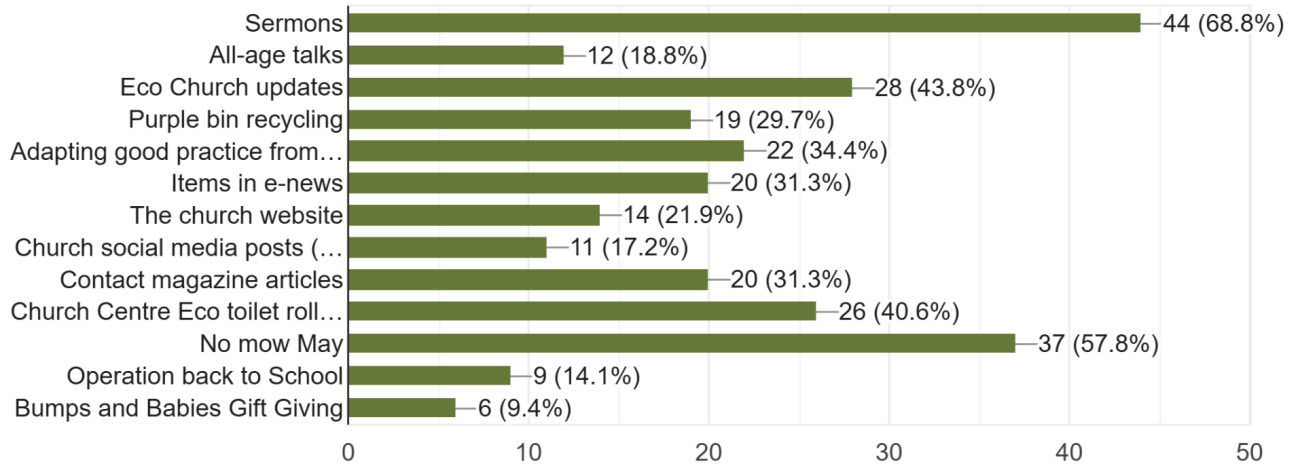
I have written to my MP asking them to vote for policies that care for creation
